# Enter & View at Healthwatch Redbridge

Healthwatch Redbridge recently carried out a number of Enter & View visits to residential care and nursing homes as well as to two hospital wards as part of our wider project to review dignity and respect in health and social care.

The findings from these visits and our recent postcard survey will be reported at our Dignity Conference that has been planned as part of this year's Healthwatch AGM on Friday 4 December.

This year, we are very pleased to have national patient's champion Ashley Brookes as our keynote speaker.

There will be an opportunity to meet people from local health and social care organisations and we have also invited our local MP's and Councillors to come along and share in the day.

Our visits enabled Enter and View Representatives to engage directly with the people who will be affected by this restructure.

### Intermediate Care Services in Redbridge - Update

We were recently invited to present a report to the Redbridge Health Scrutiny Committee raising concerns about the plans to close wards at Wanstead Hospital in favour of creating new services at King George Hospital.

### We highlighted the issues we had been made aware of including:

- Concerns from local people about the planned re-location of the service to King George Hospital and the lack of clarity in regards to their location within the hospital.
- Lack of outdoor space for rehabilitation or the provision of a family area.
- Concerns over the bed numbers being suggested, as these seemed to fall below the proposed levels suggested within the consultation.
- Lack of tangible plans, even though the proposed refurbishment was due to be completed in October. Healthwatch Redbridge had not had sight of the plans for transfer of Intermediate Care services until a stakeholder meeting held on 7th October 2015.

The Scrutiny Committee has agreed to refer the matter to the Secretary of State for Health, so that the matter can be independently reviewed.

We will continue to engage with the service provider, North East London Foundation Service (NELFT) and the commissioner, Redbridge Clinical Commissioning Group (RCCG), ensuring the patient and carer voice is heard and influences the decisions being taken.

## Healthwatch Redbridge leads award winning <mark>deaf inclusion</mark> project

This month (November) Healthwatch Redbridge was delighted to accept a national award from Compact Voices, for leading a partnership of Local Healthwatch's championing the involvement deaf people across North, Central and East London regions.

Working across London boroughs from Camden and Brent through to Havering and Barking & Dagenham, Healthwatch Redbridge developed and supported the involvement of profoundly deaf people who use British Sign Language (BSL). The project also worked closely with the British Deaf Association, a user led organisation that helped to engage and reach deaf people and involve them in a series of training sessions to become volunteer Enter & View representatives and mystery shoppers.

This work has now been recognised by Compact Voices as part of national Compact Week (2-6 November) with an award for "Advancing Equality" for its innovative and creative approach to involving a seldom heard group of people who



wanted to have their views heard on health and social care services. Invited guests included the Minister for Civil Society, Rob Wilson MP and the Mayor of Redbridge Cllr Barbara White.

Cathy Turland, Chief Executive of Healthwatch Redbridge said:

"I am absolutely delighted that this important work has been recognised not just for its creativity but also for its involvement of underrepresented groups. Deaf people have told us that for a long time they have felt unheard. Now they tell us they have a voice."

Healthwatch Redbridge recently won two Healthwatch England awards for equality and partnership working in the summer.
