Here at Healthwatch Redbridge, we have over 40 volunteers without whom we could not manage to complete our work. Our volunteers are diverse, reflecting the community we work in.


'I have worked for Healthwatch Redbridge (HWR) since August 2015.

Within this time I have carried out various tasks such as updating the data base, inputting information into Excel spreadsheet and phoning GP practices to arrange a slot for Patient Participation Group (PPG) meeting.

Whilst volunteering with Healthwatch, I was involved in a project regarding Mental Health in Adults. The project involved collating and obtaining information about the different organisations that provide mental health services in Redbridge. In addition to using the internet for research, I also used the Redbridge Concern for Mental Health (RCMH) reference book. All the information collected was tabulated in Microsoft Excel.

Having worked for HWR I have gained various skills and built my confidence back up in a working environment. I am now working at RCMH as a Service User Representative doing sessional hours. This job entails giving presentations to schools and other Organisations. So far I have only buddied presentations with my colleagues but I will ultimately be giving them on my own. My role will also entail carrying out workshops for service users and carers.

I have only recently started this post in April 2016 but I'm looking forward to using the skills that I developed as a volunteer.'





Volunteering Opportunities

We are currently recruiting for two roles. **Enter & View Representatives**

Healthwatch's are able to enter & view any premises where health or social care services are provided, for example hospital wards, care homes, GP practices, opticians and dentists. Each Enter & View visit is carried out for a specific reason. Some of our recent visits have looked at complaints systems within GP Practices, dignity and respect in Care Homes and asking service users about accessing health and social care services.

Representatives need to be local to Redbridge, a member of Healthwatch Redbridge and have some knowledge of health and social care services, gained through work or volunteering, or through personal experience. You will also need a strong desire to work for, connect with and represent the views of users and patients.

The deadline for application forms is Midnight on Wednesday 24th August. Interviews will be held on Wednesday 31st August.

The compulsory one-day training course is on Tuesday 13th September.
